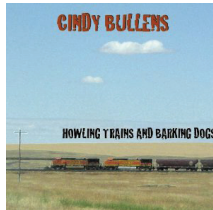

Some of those names return the favor here, resulting in a set of songs as distinctive as the personalities involved. Bullens' seamless transition from pop to country finds material like "Love Gone Good," "Good at Being Gone" and "Labor of Love" surveying a wide rootsy terrain. From back-porch ballads to wailing, rousing honky-tonk, Bullens not only survives, she thrives.

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
